Dear Clr Vandervis

I refer to your email of 1 April 2014 requesting further information under the Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987 (LGOIMA) and provide the following response.

1 - Who decided to buy the first 94 stadium TV's and on what advice?

This was a decision made by Carisbrook Stadium Trust and no information relating to this decision is held by DVML.

2 - Did DVML realise at the time they bought the new stadium TV software package that these 94 TV's were incompatible?

Whilst the original **televisions** purchased **were not** fully **compatible** with the **new** Cisco Stadium Vision, they are still able **to be** used **to** broadcast **live** feeds **of** stadium events. A small number of televisions have been redeployed for different uses within the stadium with the remainder being sold.

3 – What "increased revenue" has resulted from purchasing the newer 165 TVs and stadium TV software package?

The increased revenue as a direct result is \$59,797. Stadium Vision also enhances the customer experience during stadium events communicating upcoming events, way finding, catering options and with MICE market enhances the event/function experience through technology availability within the venue eg presentations.

4 – What has been the total cost of the stadium TV software package, the 165 TV's and associated installation costs? Please itemize.

5 – Who at the stadium was responsible for keeping the records referred to in "Unfortunately no record has been found of these actions or conversations."

It was a failure in process which has been addressed.

6 - 7 of the 94 TV's have been "Discarded due to being damaged". Under what circumstances have so many TV's been damaged and who has been held responsible?

Damage was caused being removed from walls, some had cracked edges, scratched screens and general wear and tear where no blame can be attributed.

7 - Please forward copies of original paperwork confirming payments for stadium TVs by staff members, and payments by DVML Chair Sir John Hansen and DVML Director Peter Stubbs.
